2017–2019: Founders Society



Fifty-eight founding members provide organizational stability through a three-year seed-funding commitment.





2017: First Grants

LACF makes its first discretionary grants to eight local organizations, totaling \$800.





2017: First Endowment Funds



First permanent endowments are established to benefit specific community organizations: LARSO and UNM-LA.





March 2018: Executive Director



LACF hires our first Executive Director – Rachel Kizielewicz.





2018: Financial Management System



LACF implements Foundant, a state of the art financial and fund management software.

 The first installation in New Mexico now utilized by all the major community foundations in the state.





June 30, 2019: First Endowment Grant



UNM-LA receives first endowment distribution which is used to purchase equipment for welding program.





September 2018: Investment Committee

LACF Board appoints a permanent Finance and Investment Committee to oversee investment of endowed and invested funds.





2019-22: Community Builders

Forty-eight donors make a multi-year commitment to continue organizational growth and provide discretionary grants to organizations in need.





2019-2022: Community Challenge



Enterprise Bank & Trust commits up to \$150k in matching funds for a permanent community endowment.

\$150k in public support secured in 2022.





Spring 2020: First Competitive Grants

LACF awards \$8,423 to five organizations in its first formal grantmaking cycle.





2020: COVID Support



LACF supports local and regional organizations impacted by the pandemic through a statewide consortium of community foundations. \$60,270 is brought into LA.





2020: Legacy Society Established



Committed locals pledge a portion of their legacy to LACF for lasting community support.





2021 – National Accreditation

LACF demonstrates best practices exceeding legal requirements and demonstrating accountability and excellence to the community.



- LACF is sixth nationally accredited CF in NM
- Reviewed/renewed every three years





2021: Volunteer Appreciation



LACF hosts, in collaboration with PEEC our first annual community event to celebrate volunteerism.





2022: All Together New Mexico

LACF assists statewide consortium of community foundations in distributing relief funds for Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon and Jemez (Cerro Pelado) fires.







June 2022: New Executive Director




LACF hires our second Executive Director – Steve Laurent.

- Over 500 subscribed user/volunteers






2024: 100 Men/Women Who Care




LACF hosts a monthly forum of nonprofit EDs to connect, exchange ideas, and jointly problem-solve and share in support.
























Workshops and Training
