We are *your* Los Alamos Community Foundation, started ten years ago by donors and volunteers who believed that working together we could find practical solutions to solve local needs. We have established relationships and endowments with a focus on supporting community nonprofits now and into the future. Those nonprofits help families, youth, adults, seniors, and those facing personal and financial crisis.

While service is rewarding, the turnover rate for nonprofit leadership is significant. Most Los Alamos nonprofit leaders have been in their positions for less than seven years. Board members regularly change. Beyond the ongoing trainings the Foundation offers, we host a monthly Executive Director Roundtable. During these meetings we share knowledge on fundraising, managing, finance, human resources, and so much more! This year, Los Alamos has three new nonprofit leaders, and our goal is to to help them, along with the other nonprofits, succeed. Their success is a win for all of us!

Your Foundation helps find solutions to problems. This year we learned about the need for a floor in the Los Alamos Group Home, so we researched funders and secured a grant for \$15,000 for new flooring.

LOS ALAMOS UNITING FOR **COMMUNITY HEALTH (LAUNCH)**

Los Alamos Community Foundation's new initiative, Los Alamos Uniting for Community Health (LAUNCH), brings funders and organizations together to solve complex local health problems. Over 50 people attended a LAUNCH kickoff in May.

We convene community, listen to stated needs, examine local data, connect organizations, and provide support to bring the community together to find innovative solutions. We believe focused collective efforts toward a common goal and strategic funding will lead to greater success in addressing those needs.

Our current focus is mental health. This year, 25 people were trained to provide ABC Suicide Prevention classes, awarded 6 grants supporting health programs, and are supporting monthly training sessions.

Anchorum Health Foundation Donor Advised Fund Grants

GRANTS BRIDGE THE GAPS

Competitive and Special Interest Grants are funded through a combination of unrestricted funds and distributions from Endowment Funds. Donor Advised Funds (DAF) from partners greatly boosted grant awards this year. We awarded 19 grants totaling \$81,038.

The grants below focused on building capacity.

The Community Foundation convened 64 nonprofits through 32 gatherings, roundtable discussions, and meetings.

Los Alamos Community Foundation has been instrumental in attracting new partners and funds to help improve nonprofit stability and create lasting change in our community. Here are some of the ways we have leveraged who we are to help our nonprofits.

Peer Roundtables

LACF convened monthly roundtable sessions for nonprofit directors to share information. Topics included funding opportunities, HR resources, emergency plans, and collaborative programs.

Nonprofit Training Workshops and Resources
40 nonprofits from across Northern NM participated
in our annual training program. We also host a
digital resource library, provide fundraising books to
30 nonprofits, and regularly provide guidance to
local and regional organizations.

Community Philanthropy Series

Over 50 people attended public sessions focused on tax, financial, and estate planning.

- Secured a \$12,500 grant helping Mesa to Mesa to construct a new floor for the local group home.
- Fiscal Management for 100+ Women Who Care and 100 Men Who Care, groups that that raised over \$23,000 for local non-profit organizations.
